All entries must be submitted as a pdf by March 18, 2024.

By signing the consent on the above registration form, you give Harmonium Choral Society permission to stream your music on our streaming channels, including YouTube.

- 1. The contest is open to any New Jersey high school or home-schooled student including, with the anonymity safeguards, friends or relatives of Harmonium members.
- 2. Your work must be a newly composed piece set for mixed chorus [SATB]. Arrangements of pre-existing compositions (e.g., hymns, carols, show tunes, etc.) will not be considered. Plagiarism of any kind is unacceptable and will disqualify you.
- 3. Each entry must use one of the text options found under "Contest Poems."
- 4. Handwritten scores are acceptable but must be neat and easy to read. Free software is available to notate and print your composition.

- 5. While accompaniment is not required, please score a piano reduction of your composition for rehearsal.
- 6. Performance time of the choral work must be <u>five minutes or less</u>. Longer works will not be considered.
- 7. Multiple entries by the same composer are permitted. Each entry must be documented, numbered, and submitted separately.
- 8. Have your music teacher or an adult sponsor submit a SPONSOR form for each entry at the above link.
- 9. Please include a short biography and a high-resolution photograph or headshot that is appropriate to share with the public as the winner.
- 10. Do not include your name anywhere on your composition submission to ensure anonymous judging.

11. Students who submit their pieces by March 18, 2024 will receive written feedback from composer-in-residence Martin Sedek, and the opportunity to revise their piece before

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. The judges will not be given any information about the contestants. Each submission will be assigned a number and identities will not be revealed until the winners are chosen.
- 2. Judges will provide written feedback on each submission.
- 3. Compositions will be judged on the basis of:
 - a. Harmony
 - b. Rhythm
 - c. Counterpoint and/or voice leading.
 - d. Form
 - e. Integration with text
 - f. Legibility of the score
 - g. Sing-ability: appropriate vocal ranges, avoiding harmonic shifts that are difficult for singers to produce.
 - h. Appropriate piano accompaniment (where applicable)
 - i. Uniqueness and originality
 - j. Perceived audience appeal
